

Help with document links

Due to the changes to the NCTL system and the modules, there are now several different ways in which a link to a document may open for you.


These examples are intended to help you identify instances where documents or resources are still available, but the wrapper page or intermediate page may be unfamiliar to you.

If you find that a third-party (non-NCTL) website link is not working, it can be useful to use an internet search engine to see if there is a replacement document or webpage available.

1. Archived documents

A small number of documents linked to in the modules are archived, and will show an intermediate page. Here is an example below;


4. Opening links stored in the NCTL Platform

In some cases, documents that are stored in the NCTL platform will have a wrapper page such as the one below.



Please click the link (blue text) to download the document as normal.

Alternatively, links may open a dialogue box in your browser window, depending on your settings and browser type;
